Official source of River Corridor data is tinyurf.com/floodreadyallas. Where river corridors are not mapped (i.e., a stream with a drainage area of between 0.5 and 2 square miles), the corridor is measured 50 feet horizontally from the top of the stream bank.

Data source:

- Special Flood Hazard Area boundaries (i.e. "the 100-year floodplain") are from FBMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) D-FBM (Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map) data effective September 28, 2007.
- Statewide River Corridors are from VT ANR Rivers Program 2015 data (VOIS data layer RIVERCORRIDORS).
