[Grafton Bridge #20 Replacement Project]

Construction Update

DATE: Friday, May 17, 2024

TRAFFIC IMPACT AND DURATION: Travel over Bridge #20 over the Saxtons River along Vermont Route 121 in Grafton, Vt. is permanently reduced to a single lane along the southern portion of the bridge, with alternating one-way traffic controlled by traffic signals.

The traffic signals will remain in place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, until the new bridge is constructed and opened to traffic. *Motorists are reminded to follow all traffic signals, slow down, and use caution as they travel within the work zone.*

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES: Crews will be on-site Monday, May 20, through Friday, May 24, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., to continue with the installation of stone fill in front of the first bridge abutment along the Saxtons River. Then, crews will begin to install formwork and reinforcing steel for the second bridge abutment.

The subcontractor will complete the installation of pile foundations for the second bridge abutment and continue installing the drilled shaft foundation to bedrock within the Saxtons River.

In observance of Memorial Day, crews will be off-site Monday, May 27, and will return on Tuesday, May 28, at 7:00 a.m.

LOCATION: On Vermont Route 121 East in the Town of Grafton over the Saxtons River, just east of the intersection with Fisher Hill Road.
